#### Opinion

I have audited the accompanying financial statements of Bambrew Plant Fiber Technology Private Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021, and the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

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#### 1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

"Bambrew Plant Fiber Technology Private Limited" was incorporated on 19th December, 2019. The Company is engaged in the business of manufacturing and trading of fiber based compounds and products including biodegradable, disposable or which are reusable in the nature.

# 1-A. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

# a) Basis for Preparation of Financial Statements

The Financial statements are in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, accounting standards notified under section 133 of the Companies Act 2013, read together with paragraph 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2014, as adopted consistently by the company. All income and expenditure having a material bearing on the financial statements are recognized on the accrual basis. Provisions are made for all known losses and liabilities.

#### b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) in India requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and disclosures of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements. The estimates and assumptions used in the accompanying financial statements are based upon management's evaluation of the relevant facts and circumstances as of the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognized prospectively in the current and future periods.

# c) Expenditure

Expenses are accounted on the accrual basis and provisions are made for all known losses and liabilities.

#### d) Fixed Assets

Tangible & Intangible fixed assets are stated at their original cost of acquisition and subsequent improvements thereto including taxes, duties, freight and other incidental expenses related to acquisition and installation of the assets concerned.

#### e) Investments

Investments are shown at cost, except where provision is considered necessary.



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#### f) Depreciation

Depreciation in respect of fixed assets is provided adopting Written Down Value method at rates provided under Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. Depreciation is charged on pro-rata basis for assets purchased / sold during the year. The company is of the opinion that the residual value of fixed assets at the year-end is in line with the life of assets, based on the depreciation already provided.

#### g) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized on accrual basis. The entity recognizes revenue when significant risk and rewards are transferred to the customer, the amount of revenue can be reliably measured, it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity and specific criteria have been met for each of the entity's activities.

The entity bases its estimates on historical results, taking into consideration the type of customer, the type of transaction and the specifics of each arrangement. Revenue on holiday packages is recognized on gross basis on the date of departure of the tour.

Interest income is recognized on time proportion basis.

#### h) Employee Benefits

#### Short Term Employee Benefits:

The employee benefits payable only within 12 months of rendering the services are classified as short term employee benefits. Benefits such as salaries, leave travel allowance, short term compensated absences, etc., and the expected costs of bonus are recognized in the period in which the employee renders the related services.

#### Post-Employment Benefits:

The company is in process of enumeration of post-employment benefits.

#### i) Provisions

Provision is recognized when an enterprise has present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are determined based on management estimates required to settle the obligation as at the Balance Sheet date.

Basic Earnings per Share is computed by dividing net income by the weighted average number of common stock outstanding during the period. The number of shares used in computing diluted earnings per share comprises the weighted average shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share, and also the weighted average number of equity shares that could have been issued on the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares. The diluted potential equity shares are adjusted for the proceeds receivable, had the shares been actually issued at fair value (i.e., the average market value of the outstanding shares). Diluted potential equity shares are deemed converted as of the beginning of the period, unless issued at a later date.

#### k) Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition of qualifying assets are capitalized as a part of cost of such assets.

#### l) Leases

Operating Leases: Asset taken on Lease under which, all the risk and rewards of ownership are effectively retained by the lessor are classified as Operating Lease. Operating Leases are recognized as expenses on accrual basis in accordance with the respective Lease Agreement.

#### m)Deferred Tax

Deferred tax is recognized, subject to the consideration of prudence, in respect of deferred tax liability / asset on timing differences, being the difference between taxable income and accounting income.

#### n) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each year, the Company determines whether a provision should be made for impairment loss on fixed assets by considering the indications that an impairment loss may have occurred in accordance with Accounting Standard-28 "Impairment of Assets" prescribed under the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014, where the recoverable amount of any fixed asset is lower than its carrying amount, a provision for impairment loss on fixed assets is made for the difference.

# o) Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets:

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there
is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of
resources.
